

The residents participated in cooking groups where they made Christmas cakes, rum balls, and shortbread.






Archbishop Goody Christmas

Carols by Candlelight


Our Carols by Candlelight was a magical evening in the garden, with residents and their loved ones gathered at sunset amidst twinkling Christmas lights.


