Birthday party concert


Birthdays were a big part of March at Sister Mary Glowrey, with fourteen resident birthdays.

St. Patrick's Day


St. Patrick's Day at Ocean Star was filled with fun and festivities!

Sonia's morning tea


A special morning tea was hosted by Sonia, our pastoral care practitioner.
